The library will host a smoking cessation workshop on Wednesday, January 18, at 7:30 p.m. in the Cranford Community Center. The program will be presented by Katherine DiDonato, Ph.D., a clinical psychologist currently working at the Summit Medical Group's Behavioral Health and Cognitive Therapy Center. Dr. DiDonato has received special training from the American Lung Association and she has been running smoking cessation groups at Summit Medical Group since 2012.
