Digital Content in a Variety of Formats Now Available from hoopla

The library recently added hoopla digital to its array of online resources. Available to Cranford Public Library card holders, hoopla contains nearly half a million titles in six different formats: movies, TV, music albums, e-audiobooks, e-books, and comics/graphic novels. There are no hold lists. Every item is available immediately. To register for hoopla digital with your Cranford Library card, use your mobile device to download the hoopla digital app from the Apple or Google Play store. If you are using a computer, visit hoopladigital.com/home. Hoopla can also be accessed by going to cranfordlibrary.org and clicking on the *Online Resources* tab. To register, you will need your library card number and Personal Identification Number. In order to use hoopla, you must be a patron in good standing—i.e., no money owed, no overdue materials, and a valid, unexpired Cranford Library card.
