We Have Baby Boxes!



Baby boxes are baby starter kits inspired by the 75-year-old baby box tradition in Finland. Baby box distribution has helped Finland achieve one of the world's lowest infant mortality rates. Each baby box includes a custom mattress with a fitted sheet so it can be used like a bassinet. The boxes include new parent supplies, such as diapers and wipes, and a board book,

complements of the Friends of the Cranford Public Library. All expecting and new parents are eligible to participate. In order to claim your free baby box: (1) register at Baby Box University at babyboxuniversity.com; (2) log onto babyboxuniversity.com and watch a brief educational video; (3) complete the quiz that follows the video and receive a certificate of completion; (4) print the certificate; (5) stop by or call the Children's Department (908-709-7272, ext. 2103) to arrange to pick up your baby box. You will need to present your certificate of completion in order to claim your box.
